Interview Questions

- Describe your high school journey. Explain how family background, interests, hobbies, sports, clubs, accomplishments, and passions have impacted your growth.
- 2. Describe and share examples of your greatest strengths, academically and personally.
- 3. Describe an obstacle or obstacles you have faced throughout your high school journey and how you overcame.
- 4. Clearly identify and explain your plans for after you graduate from high school and how you arrived at this plan.
 - a. Courses taken
 - b. Experiences
 - c. Job Shadow
 - d. Any changes in your plan along the way
- 5. Describe the steps you have taken towards your 'E'. Explain the following based on your 'E'.

Employed	 Who is your employer? Where did you apply? What is your job description? Describe the interview process. Describe your long-term plan.
Enlisted	 Which branch of the military will you join and why? Describe where you are in the process of being enlisted. (Met with a recruiter, taken ASVAB, passed MEPS, attended Basic, etc.) Describe your long-term plan for the military.
Enrolled	 Which post-secondary institutions did you apply? Describe where you selected to attend and what you plan to study. Describe how you are going to pay for your post-secondary plan (FAFSA/WAFSA, scholarships, savings, etc.) Describe your long-term plan after you earn a degree or certificate (graduation).

Distinguished Reflections

Student reflects on the prompts below and submits their reflections to their advisor. Reflections can be submitted in a variety of formats (written, video, etc.) and are reviewed by a committee looking for:

Learning Reflection - address the following:

- Academic history
- Strengths and weaknesses in areas such as attendance, academics, and employability skills
- Post-secondary academic goal

Planner Reflection - address the following:

- Evolution of post-secondary plan when beginning high school to current postsecondary plan
- Steps taken that led you to your current post-secondary plan
- Future plans, where do you see yourself in 5, 10, 20 years

Citizen Reflection - address the following:

- Citing examples of volunteer service, describe your personal experience
- Other ways you have been an active member in our community
- Impact of your involvement in the community
